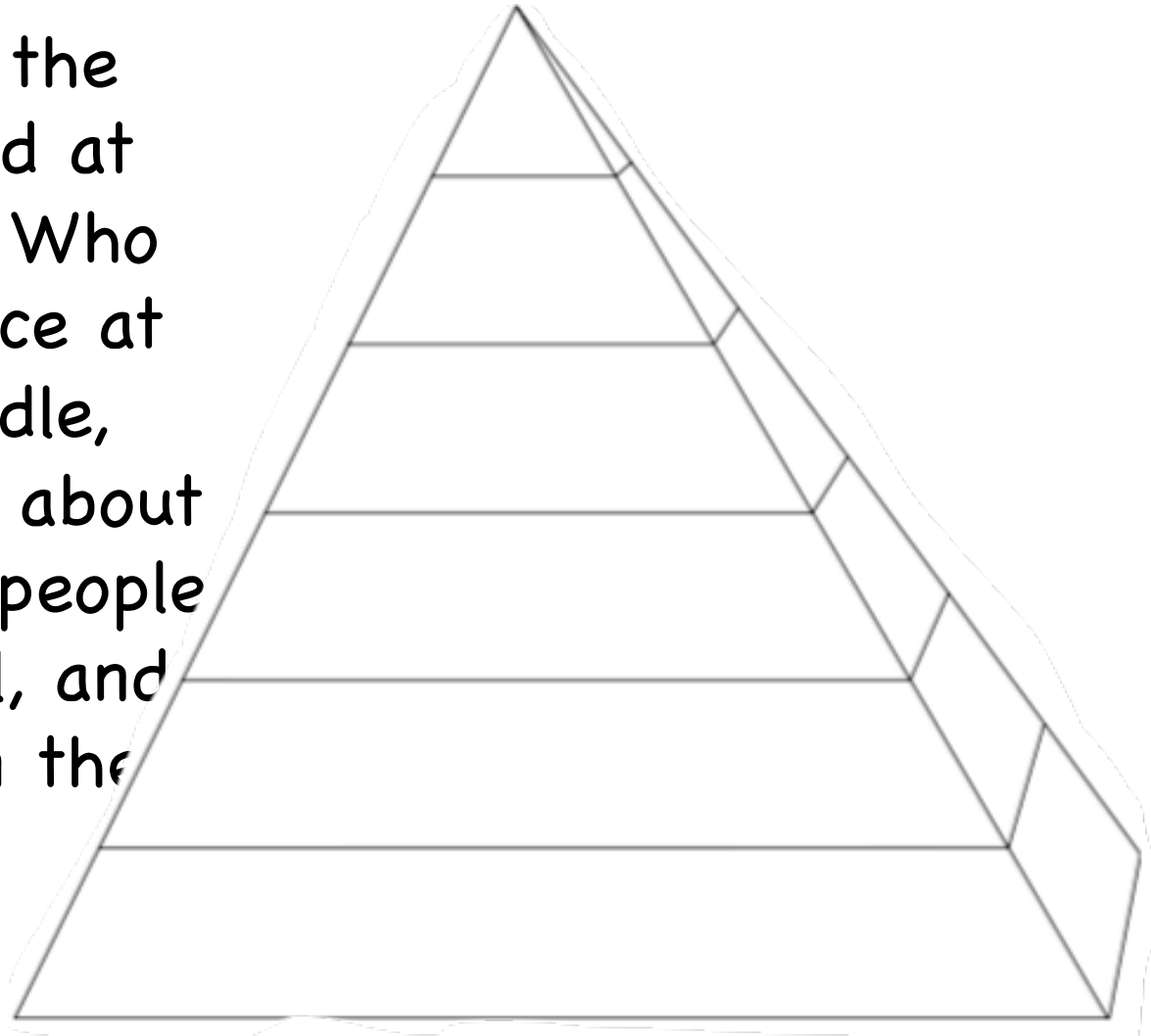

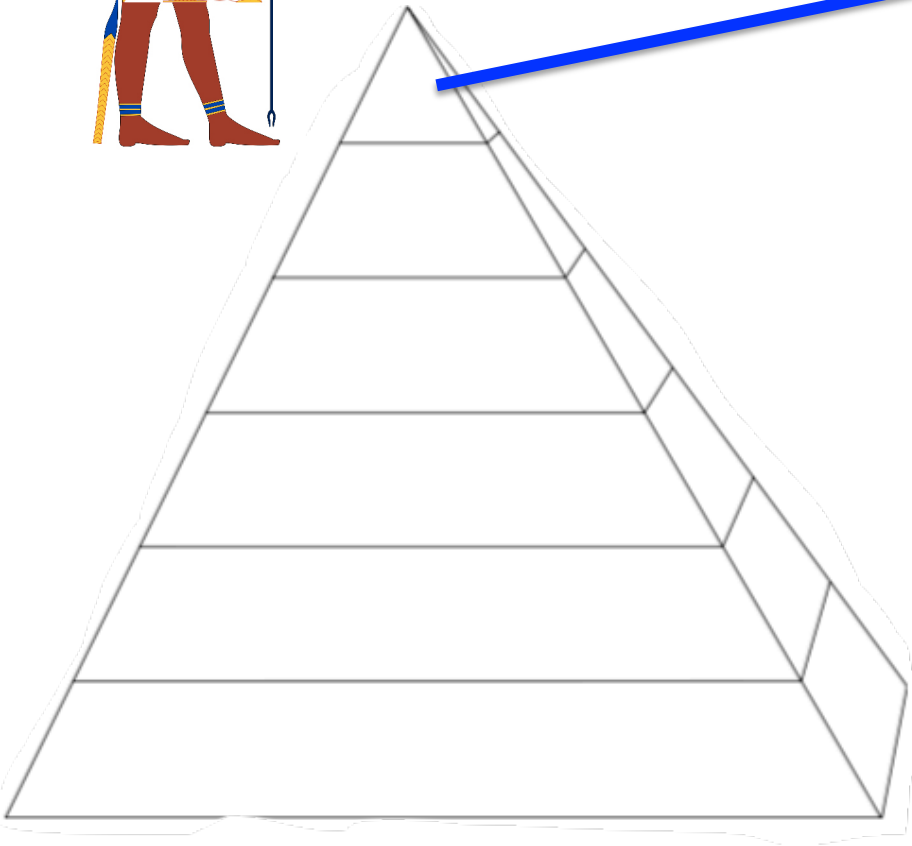

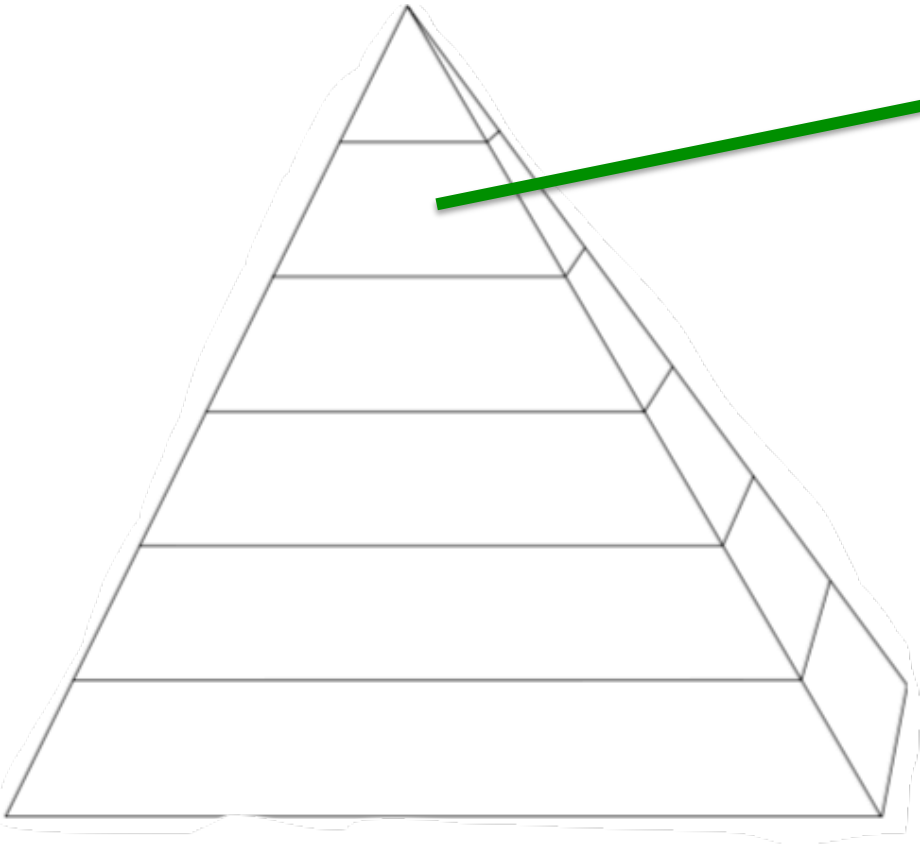


- The supreme ruler over all of Egypt, wore a special crown known as the double crown (combination of white and red symbolizing the joining of Upper and Lower Egypt)



# Government Officials

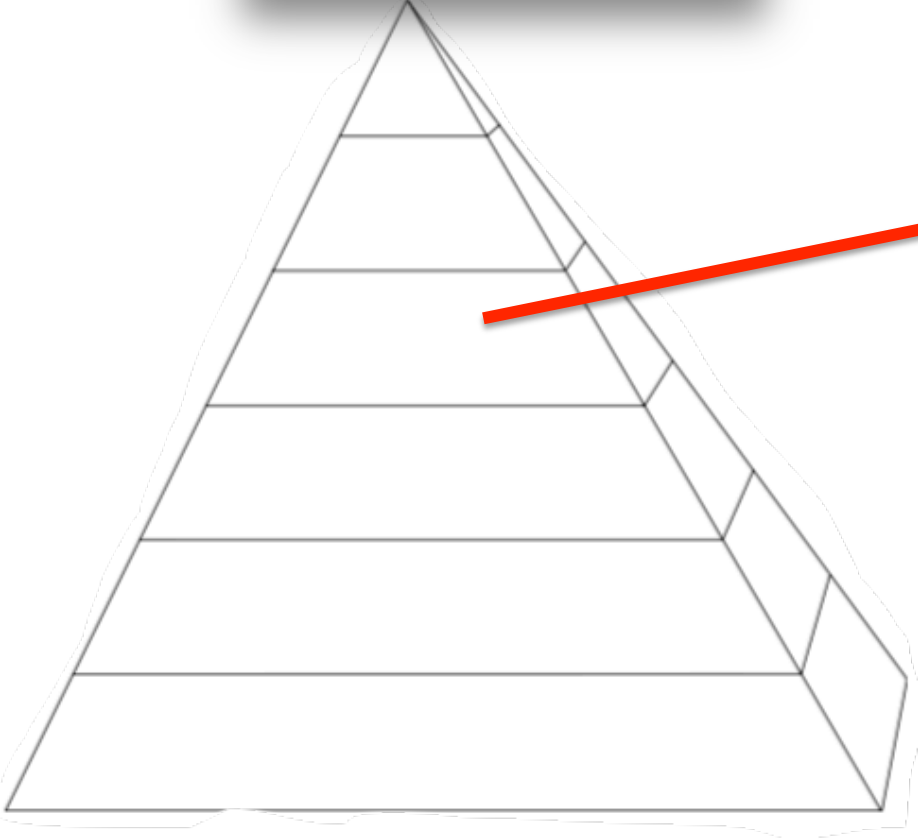
- Powerful, wealthy, noble families, very high quality of life

- Religious leaders, in charge of temples and rituals, in charge of death and burial

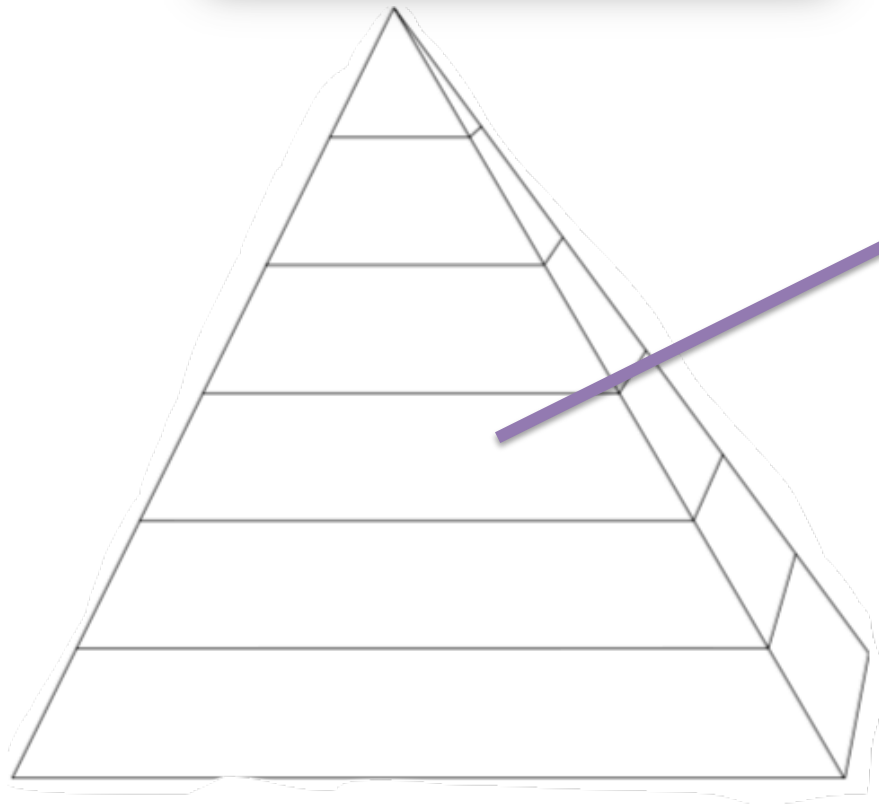






# Scribe

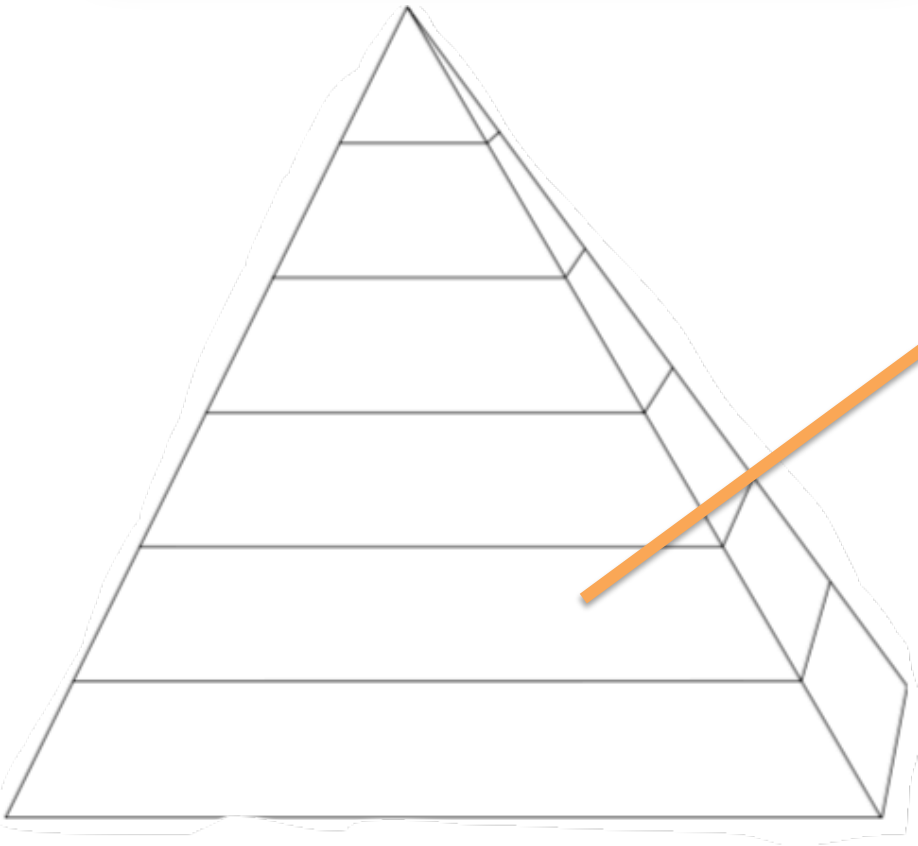
- Recorded information for government and religious leaders





# Artisans

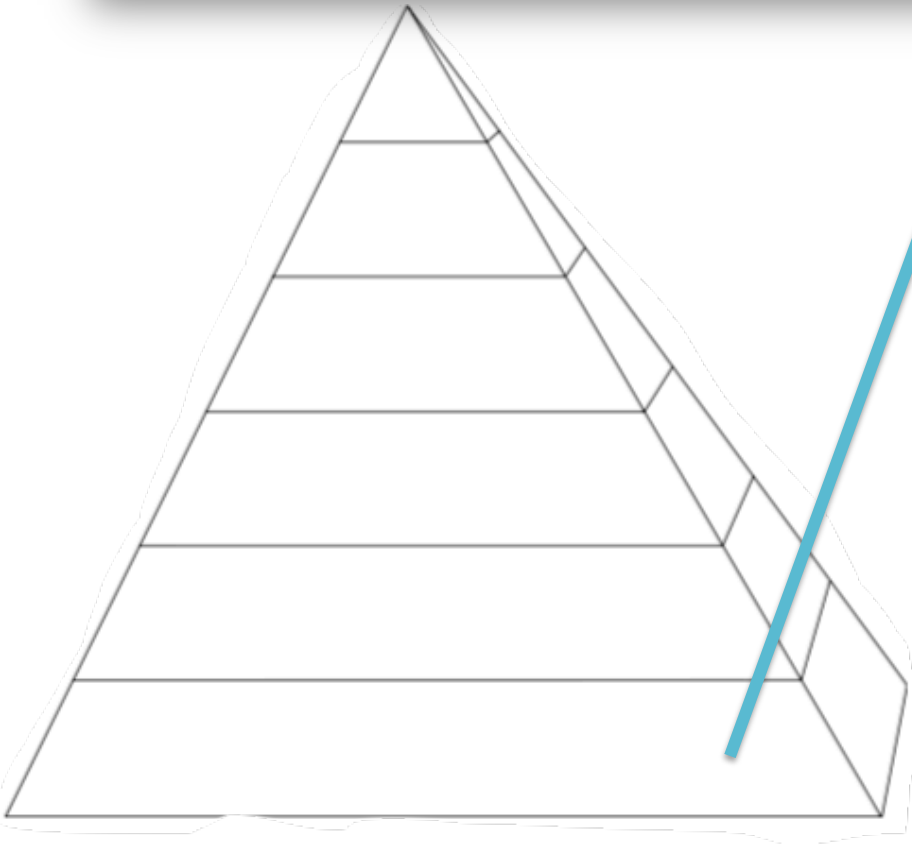
- Crafts people, carpenters, metalworkers, painters, sculptors, stone carvers
